Sarah:

Per your request, I conducted cultural resources investigations for the East Elk Grove Parish Project (Project) to determine the archaeological and historic sensitivity of the Project site. The investigation included a review of previous cultural resources projects and records searches conducted in the area for the City of Elk Grove (City). Nearly the entire Project site (APN 121-0220-008) has not been previously surveyed for cultural resources. Several surveys, however, have been conducted in the general area. None of the previous surveys in the area of the Project identified any significant cultural resources (e.g., prehistoric sites, historic sites, historic buildings, or isolated artifacts). A residence is located on the Project site at 8800 Bradshaw Road, but this property was recorded and determined ineligible for the National Register of Historic Places and the California Register of Historical Resources as part of staffs' investigations for the Sheldon Road/Bradshaw Road Improvements Project in 2004. Indeed, investigations for the road project included a narrow segment of the Project site along Bradshaw Road.

Staff's cultural resources experience in the City of Elk Grove suggests that the Project site is not sensitive for the presence of cultural resources. Therefore, it is not anticipated that implementation and completion of the east Elk Grove Parish Project would likely affect any historical resources or unique archaeological resources. Regardless, the area is not formally surveyed for the presence/absence of cultural resources; consequently I recommend that the mitigation measures related to cultural resources, particularly measures related to the inadvertent discovery of cultural resources and human remains, in the City's General Plan be included as mitigation measures in the environmental documents for the East Elk Grove Parish Project.
