**Response 1**

Safety issues related to the Georgia-Pacific and Suburban Propane facilities are addressed in Draft EIR Section 4.5, Hazards. The risk associated with Georgia-Pacific and Suburban Propane is considered to be less than significant. As stated in the Draft EIR,

“The vast majority of the project site falls within the one chance in 10,000,000 to 100,000,000 zone with the exception of a small portion along the eastern boundary of District D where the risk is within the zone of one chance in 1,000,000 to 10,000,000. It should be noted that District D is in the upper limits of the zone closer to the one chance in 10,000,000 area. The most common acceptable risk in the international standards and used in this EIR to constitute significance is one chance in 1,000,000 of a fatality per year. This means that all locations 600 feet and farther beyond the Suburban Propane and Georgia Pacific fenceline are defined as acceptable. It should be noted that no public residences, parks, etc., are within 600 feet of the fenceline. Thus, the risk level posed by these facilities are viewed as acceptable and impacts are considered to be less than significant.” (Draft EIR, page 4.5-23)
